Dear Members and Friends of St. Mark's,

On January 6, the church celebrates the Epiphany of Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ (also known as the Adoration of the Wise Men). Epiphany does not fall on a Sunday this year and unlike 2020, Epiphany Eve (January 5) is not a Sunday either. In many ways the Epiphany is much more significant to us Christians with a non-Jewish background than Christmas. A careful reading of the Christmas Story from Luke (2:1-14) reminds us that those who came to see Jesus the night he was born were Jews not Gentiles. Gentiles came much later (almost two years later) as represented by the Wise Men. To be certain that we do not forget the significance of the Epiphany when January 5 or 6 does not fall on a Sunday, an "Epiphany Quiz", such as the one included in this edition of the Lion, can be most helpful. Don't worry, it's open book (the bible) and can be a lot of fun. So, here we go.

The key phrase in answering all questions correctly is "According to scripture"

- 1. Where do the wise men come from? (Matthew 2:1)
- 2. How many wise men are mentioned? (Matthew 2:1)
- 3. What are the names of the wise men? (Matthew 2: 1)
- 4. How do the wise men know Jesus is born? (Matthew 2:2)
- 5. How do the wise men know to go to Bethlehem? (Matthew 2:4-8)
- 6. In what dwelling to the wise men find Jesus? (Matthew 2:11)
- 7. What gifts did the wise men bring to Jesus? (Matthew 2:11)


