Members and Friends of St. Mark's,

Thursday, May 13, 2021 is "Ascension Day", 40 days Not that far fetched a possibility: since Easter Sunday. Usually the church does not make that big a deal of the ascension. Most of the time, if it is celebrated at all, it is done so on the Sunday that follows the event (the Seventh Sunday of Easter is often referred to as Ascension Sunday). Hollywood, my guess would be in an attempt to tell the Christ story in a succinct and meaningful way, often depicts the ascension taking place the same Sunday of the resurrection, but this is not the biblical timetable.

The Ascension of Our Lord (Jesus rejoining the Trinity to reign in eternal majesty in heaven) is essential to our faith. Without the ascension the risen Christ becomes more like a ghost, appearing and disappearing without much purpose. The ascension provides closure to the story of the earthly life, ministry and mission of Jesus and assures the church that Jesus, though ascended, has not gone away. The ascension reassures the church that Jesus reigns as Lord and King for all the universe and throughout all time. At the time of the first HAPPENING THIS MONTH: century when a great teacher sat down it signaled he or she had finished teaching. In celebrating the ascension we proclaim as stated in the Nicene and Apostles' Creeds that Jesus' work is now complete, he is, "...seated at the right hand of the Father." He has fulfilled all things necessary for our salvation.

The ascension affirms that "Our God Reigns"! Nothing changes this truth, nothing can change this truth. Jesus is not just alive, he reigns on high and we are to do his bidding; we are servants of the "Ascended One". The ministry and mission of St. Mark's, the ELCA, and all people of God known as Church is the work of the Ascended Christ, the Eternal King. When we love others as he loves us, we proclaim "Our God reigns!" When we pray for our own circumstances and those of others, we proclaim "Our God reigns!" When we worship, receive Holy Communion, or witness a baptism, we proclaim "Our God reigns!"

Our God is real! Our God is alive! The way and work of Jesus is the way and work of God. The way and work of Jesus is our way and work. When we live it we continue to be people of God.

Although we have returned to in-person worship and some aspects of our everyday lives have improved, we are still being called to serve those in need. Please consider making a donation to one or all of the following ministries in these unprecedented times. Tubs and a table are available for your donations in the Narthex. ****

ONGOING COLLECTIONS AT ST. MARK'S:

United Churches Food Pantry: The Pantry is once again accepting non-perishable food items. Items most in need are canned fruits, tomato sauce, Ramen noodles, cereal, Hamburger Helper, elbow macaroni and healthy snacks.

Shepherd of the Streets: Hygiene items in regular sizes for children women and men are always needed. Specific needs are dish soap, hand soap, sunscreen for children and adults and laundry pods in smaller household packages.

Blessing Boxes at New Covenant UCC: Individual healthy snacks and crackers, Cup of Soups, Microwave mac and cheese or other pasta foods, ramen noodles and socks (new or gently used) are needed. FYI: Travel size shampoo, conditioner, soap and toothpaste are also needed for the Blessing Box. Many homeless people prefer this smaller size due to the inability to store larger sizes.
