Ongoing Collections at St. Mark's:

Ongoing Collections at St. Mark's:

The Outreach Committee thanks the members of St. Mark's for the many food items, hygiene products, snacks and monetary funds (take-out containers) that were donated from May through June 2021. All of the ministries receiving these items were so thankful for St. Mark's support of their efforts on behalf of those less fortunate than us. May you be blessed as you have blessed others.

RE: Church Columbarium

Discussions regarding the possible expansion of the St. Mark's Lutheran Church Columbarium have begun. The 60-niche Columbarium is located on the north wall of the Chapel, and all but two of the existing units have been purchased. These were installed in 2003.

The church Council is attempting to gauge interest among St. Mark's members to determine if additional Lutheran World Relief. As in the past we will be making niches should be added to the Columbarium. The price school kits, fabric kits, baby kits, and personal care kits.
