### Pastor's "Lion" Message (October 2021)

Dear Members and Friends of St. Mark's,  
In 2021 Monday, October 11, is designated as Columbus Day, the day aside by American society to honor the explorer credited with "Discovering America".

Way back in 1992 (29 years ago), I was living in Nescopeck, Pennsylvania, just over the bridge from Berwick. To commemorate the 500<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Columbus' historic voyage, the Berwick Area Ministerium hosted a "Founder's Day Celebration". The Ministerium named this celebration "Founder's Day" because it included both European and Native American history. The goal was to remember that when Columbus arrived in the New World, there were indigenous people already present for whom that land was considered home.

The attitude of the Berwick Area Ministerium in 1992 is a far better attitude for all Americans, especially those who identify as Christians to embrace, rather than the present attitude of today. There is a way of thinking in American society that seeks not to unite, but to divide; to rank races, cultures and individuals in such a way as to make some seem inferior to those of European descent. Such thinking fuels the engines of hate, prejudice and bigotry. Such thinking led to the violent attack on our nation's capitol on January 6, 2021. Christ teaches us that as his followers such attitudes are not to be part of our lives. We are not to think of ourselves as superior to other human beings because of our race, culture or history. As the church we are first, foremost and always, members of the body of

Christ. The color of our skin and the history of our culture can be something in which to take pride, but not to the point of feeling superior toward others. The primary direction of how we live, and move and have our being is to be that of Christ, not politics and certainly not domination.

Prejudice toward others because of who they are or what they look like is not something that disappeared at the end of the mid-1970s. That demon is still with us and as a result still needs to be something of which to repent.

On Sunday, October 31, St. Mark's will celebrate Reformation Day. Reformation Day reminds us of Martin Luther's teaching that God's message is one of acceptance, forgiveness, love and life eternal. May we, the spiritual descendants of Luther, learn to more fully embrace this message of grace and apply it to how we recognize Columbus Day and all our days!

## Sharing in the Caring

The Outreach Committee continues to accept monetary donations for the purchase of take-out containers for Redeemer Lutheran Church and Sojourner Truth Ministries. Thank you to those who have donated in the past. These monetary donations have provided more than 1,100 containers this past summer. Checks may be made payable to St. Mark's with the memo line reading TAKE-OUT.

Once again, the Outreach Committee will be providing dessert for Redeemer Lutheran's Community Dinner on Thursday, October 14, 2021. We will be providing homemade cookies for 120 people. We will need 20 dozen cookies to provide two cookies per person. **Can you provide a batch of your favorite cookie?** Please no peanut butter cookies. Cookie donations must be at St. Mark's kitchen by 1:00 PM on Wednesday, October 13, 2021. We are also accepting monetary donations for purchasing bakery cookies and plastic bags for packaging. Checks may be made payable to St. Mark's with the memo line reading MEALS. Speak with Becky Miller Pryor if you will be providing cookies. The **Card Ministry at St. Mark's** is in full swing. In addition to the Outreach Committee making cards available to the congregation for special times of the year, several members of the congregation are choosing a month and sending

a variety of cards to our Special Concern Folks and others at St. Mark's. All cards, stamps and a list of folks receiving cards are provided. We request that approximately two cards per week be sent. ## Ongoing Collections at St. Mark's:

- **United Churches Food Pantry:** Non-perishable food items are always in need.
- **Shepherd of the Streets:** Hygiene Items in regular sizes for infants, kids and adults are always in need. Specific needs are laundry detergent pods (small packs) and razors and shaving cream for men and women.
- **Blessing Boxes at New Covenant UCC:** Individual healthy snacks and crackers, microwave soups and pasta, ramen noodles, deodorant and socks (new or gently used.) Travel-size hygiene items are also accepted.
- **Sojourner Truth Ministries:** This ministry provides either eat-in or take-out meals to 70-100 people Mondays through Saturdays. This month they are in need of spices (garlic or onion powder, red pepper flakes, oregano, cinnamon, etc.), steel wool scrubbies and XL trash bags.
- **Items for the Food Pantry, Shepherd of the Street's, Blessing Boxes and Sojourner Truth may be placed on the table or in the bins in the Narthex.**
- **Aluminum Soda Can Tabs:** Containers are available in the Narthex and Fellowship Hall. Tabs are given to support the Ronald McDonald House in Danville.
- **Pennies for Youth Activities:** A container is available in the Narthex for your donations.

### **Torrison Medical Scholarship awards announced**

CHICAGO (September 13, 2021) — The Dr. George and Emma J. Torrison Scholarship Fund makes scholarships available to students who intend to pursue careers in medicine. An endowment in memory of George and Emma J. Torrison makes these awards possible, with additional support from the Frederick W. Williams Scholarship Endowment. Both endowments are managed by the Foundation of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA).

The program was established in the American Lutheran Church, a predecessor of the ELCA. The program is managed by the Network of ELCA Colleges and Universities but is not restricted to the graduates of ELCA colleges and universities.

The Torrison program is open annually to any member of the ELCA admitted to an accredited medical college.

Students awarded \$5,000 Torrison Medical Scholarships for 2021-22 are: Samantha Engrav, from Concordia College, Moorhead, Minn., who will attend the Mayo Clinic Alix School of Medicine in Rochester, Minn.; Glenn Seela, from Concordia, who will attend the University of Minnesota Medical School in Minneapolis; Yanick Tade, from Concordia, who will attend the Creighton University School of Medicine in Omaha, Neb.; Danielle Karch, from the University of Wisconsin—La Crosse, who will attend the Medical College of Wisconsin in Wauwatosa; and Austin Thompson, from Wartburg College, Waverly, Iowa, who will attend the Case Western Reserve University School of Medicine in Cleveland.

“Lutherans entering medical school are nominated annually to apply for a Torrison Medical Scholarship by ELCA colleges and universities and by campus ministries in the ELCA’s Lutheran Campus Ministry Network,” said Mark Wilhelm, program director for the [Network of ELCA Colleges and Universities](#). “This competitive scholarship program has supported over 200 first-year medical students who are members of this church since 1988.”

The application process for the Torrison Scholarship Program begins in the fall. The window for applications opens in November, with applications due no later than the end of the following July. Award announcements are typically made by Sept. 1.
