Pastor's "Lion" Message for November, 2021

Dear Members and Friends of St. Mark's,

In *All in the Family* the popular situation comedy of the 1970s, Archie Bunker leads a rare but telling grace before an evening meal: "Lord, we thank you for all the food before us even though we had to get it ourselves."

By all standards Archie's prayer leaves a lot to be desired. Most pastors, including myself, would not recommend it. However, we shouldn't dismiss it entirely. It does possess a grain of "good theology".

Most persons when they pray before a meal thank our Lord for what they are about to receive. All well and good. But then they make a crucial mistake. They equate the goodness of the Lord with material things such as food, a good life, safety, etc., almost as if to reason, "If we do not receive these things, it must be a sign that God does not love us or that we are doing something wrong". Jesus teaches us by way of the Lord's Prayer, which we are to emulate, that we are not to look to the Lord as providing bread rather we are to thank the Lord for being our bread. "Give us this day our daily bread" refers to the goodness of the Lord, not the bread itself. Jesus reminds us that the Lord is everything we need and therefore, sustains us. Because of God's goodness we receive God's love. That love includes food, shelter, a comfortable life. God's love empowers, enables and inspires us to provide food for ourselves and for others.

On November 25, 2021, our nation celebrates a National Day of Thanksgiving. Instead of looking at Thanksgiving Day as a day dedicated to food, I suggest we take some time to practice what the day asks: To Give Thanks. A day of thanksgiving is to be a day to give thanks and for those of us who follow Jesus and take his words seriously, to give thanks to the Lord who is our bread that we may have and enjoy life and life eternal.

I wouldn't suggest we use Archie's prayer at our Thanksgiving tables, but we shouldn't dismiss it altogether. He does manage to remind us that Christ is our bread of life!

Thanks to all of you for the great support of the kits project for Lutheran World Relief. While not quite making the goals I set, the response was very good in this current climate. The following kits were delivered to the Synod Office in Lewisburg -42 school kits, 11 personal care kits, 7 baby kits, and 5 fabric kits - Great work! Remember, you can buy items for kits any time during the year. We also had 6 quilts (really nice work) and 4 blankets. If you wish to donate a blanket please note it must be close to 60" by 80" and cotton, polyester or cotton/polyester blend. No polar fleece. Money is also needed to ship the items. Sharing in the Caring

The Outreach Committee thanks Susan Newcomer for providing all the cookies for Redeemer's October Community dinner and giving us the night off from packaging. The cookies looked both delicious and attractive in their ribboned bags.

We are certain those receiving meals enjoyed them. Redeemer is once again asking if the Outreach Committee could provide dessert for Redeemer's Community Dinner on Thursday, November 11, 2021. We accepted their request and will be providing cookies and candy kisses or chocolate miniatures in individual packages. The Church Council and Personnel Committee are providing all 21 dozen cookies that will be needed! We are still in need of zip lock sandwich bags for 125 packages and bags of candy kisses or miniature chocolates. All cookies and chocolates for this event must be at St. Mark's kitchen by 1:00 PM on Wednesday, November 10, 2021. Donations of zip lock bags and bags of candy kisses or miniature chocolates can be placed on the tables in the Narthex if you do not wish to wait until the deadline. The Outreach Committee will assemble all 125 packages later that evening for delivery to Redeemer on Thursday, November 11.

We are accepting monetary donations for purchasing anything not donated. Checks may be made payable to St. Mark's with the memo line reading MEALS.

Ongoing Collections at St. Mark's:

- <u>United Churches Food Pantry:</u> Items most in need are small cans of Coffee, Pop Tarts, Rice, Hamburger Helper, Condiments, Jell-O and Pudding Mixes.
- <u>Shepherd of the Streets:</u> Hygiene Items in regular sizes for infants, kids, men and women are always in need. Specific needs

this month are Kleenex, Band-Aids, Women's Deodorant, Razors and Shaving Cream for men and women.

- <u>Blessing Boxes at New Covenant UCC:</u> Individual Healthy Snacks and Crackers, Microwave Soups and Pasta, Ramen Noodles, Deodorant and Socks (new or gently used for men and women.) Travel-size Hygiene Items are especially needed.
- Sojourner Truth Ministries: This ministry provides meals to approximately 70 people each day, Mondays through Saturdays. This month they are in need of steel wool scrubbies, cooking oil, jars of mayonnaise and aluminum foil.
- Items for the Food Pantry, Shepherd of the Streets, Blessing Boxes and Sojourner Truth may be placed on the table or in the bins in the Narthex.
- <u>Aluminum Soda Can Tabs:</u> Containers are available in the Narthex and Fellowship Hall. Tabs are given to support the Ronald McDonald House in Danville.
