Our <u>ANNUAL MEETING</u> will take place on Sunday, December 12 immediately following 9:30 a.m. Holy Communion. There will be <u>one worship time on this</u> <u>Sunday</u>. By action of our Church Council St. Mark's will host <u>one annual meeting</u> and not two as in previous years. The business of the meeting will be to vote on our annual 2022 budget, members of Church Council, and special projects of the congregation. Hope to see you there!

CHRISTMAS WORSHIP TIMES:

+ Friday, December 24, 7 p.m. A brief "Family Friendly Service" with a message especially appropriate to children. Join us for candlelight liturgy, Holy Communion, familiar carols.

+ Friday, December 24,10 p.m. "Traditional Holy Communion by Candlelight" substituting carols for the Christmas Liturgy. + Sunday, December 26,9:30 a.m. "The Feast of Stephen"; the First Sunday of Christmas. Our theme will be why the day we remember the death of the first deacon, Stephen, is part of our Christmas tradition. The story of "Good King Wenceslaus" will be shared and sung.

ADVENT AND CHRISTMAS SYMBOLS HELP TELL THE STORY:

BLUE: The color of hope. Often Mary, Mother of Lord is dressed in blue and in some parts of Europe all newborns regardless of gender receive a "blue" blanket. Blue reminds us that our God and the message of the gospel is one of hope and not despair.

WREATHS OF HOLLY AND IVY:

Holly and ivy are symbols of our Lord's passion, death and resurrection. Advent and Christmas begin the story of God's love. They should never be separated from it. The red berries of holly remind us of the blood of Jesus. The red bow on wreaths (which should always be at the top not the bottom of the wreath), remind us how the love (blood) of Jesus mingles down upon all the world. The green color of wreaths and swags remind us of God love and life eternal (ever-living and ever-green).



PINE AND GARLANDS: Reminders of God's gift of life eternal. God "wraps" this world in a message of love, life eternal and love.



BRANCHES OF CEDAR: Symbol of royalty. Cedar is the "wood of kings" and was used to construct the Temple of Jerusalem. Cedar reminds us that Jesus is the "New Temple" who enfolds us and calls us to worship.

CANDY CANE: Red stripes are reminiscent of the "stripes of Jesus' crucifixion". White is the color of purity and life eternal. The cane shape can be seen as a shepherd's crook (the good shepherd and the shepherds who came to worship Jesus) and when inverted becomes a "J" for Jesus.



LIGHTS: Jesus is the "Light of the World."

ANGEL: Angels tell the news of Jesus' birth.

STAR: A "star" guided the wise men to Jesus (the event known as Epiphany).



MISLETOE: An ancient symbol of peace calling to mind Jesus as Prince of Peace (hence the kiss of peace).

There are many symbols, traditions and decorations which tell the story of Jesus among us. Those listed here are some of the more popular. What are your family's symbols, decorations and traditions? How do they "tell the story ?"
