Pastor's "Lion" Message for February, 2022

Dear Members and Friends of St. Mark's, On Wednesday, February 16, the church remembers Philipp Melancthon. Melancthon is often referenced as Martin Luther's friend and associate, a theologian and professor who agreed with the Lutheran reforms. A careful reading of history however tells us that Melancthon was much more than one who simply agreed with Luther. Philipp Melancthon was the author of the Augsburg Confession, the document that more than any other states the theology and rationale for the Lutheran reforms. "If it please Christ, Melanchthon will make many Martins; he knows well the Rock of Christ... As a man of might, he will prove his ability." (Martin Luther). Philipp Melancthon could and should be called the first systematic theologian of Lutheranism.

But this is only part of why the church remembers him. Melancthon sought the reforms of Luther in a more ecumenical spirit. Where Luther was bold and earthy, Melancthon was shy and refined. Where Luther was exclusive in his opinion, Melancthon was more inclusive. Philipp Melancthon sought to reform the church with and by other voices. He embraced and taught Luther's reforms by way of scholasticism and used such to appeal to nations and reformers outside of Germany. Because of Melancthon, Moravian Christians (descendants of Jan Hus who embraced many of Luther's reforms some 100 years before Luther) adopted his phrase of, "In essentials, unity; in differences, liberty; in all things, charity", when defining their unique tradition. Because of Melancthon's influence the Book of Common Prayer of the English Reformation reflects some Lutheran ideals.

The influence of Philipp Melancthon is an ecumenical influence. He belongs to the entire church. Like his mentor and friend Martin Luther, Philipp Melancthon teaches us faith's true meaning, "*Faith is nothing else than trust in the divine mercy of Christ.*" *Philipp Melancthon.*

We are to have a "life-long learning encounter with Christ." The name change reminds us what scripture proclaims: "In following Jesus we are the students of the Master Teacher."

Committee Chairpersons, Committee Members, Pastor Vasey and Members of Council are welcoming of these changes. Please keep these committees, and all ministries of the church before the Lord in prayer as we all strive to serve Christ in faith.

Members of St. Mark's donated a total of 15 ten-dollar grocery gift cards and 3 fifteen-dollar grocery gift cards to be used by clients of the United Churches Food Pantry. Hats, Gloves and Mittens, Oh My!

The Newberry Branch of NGA (National Giving Alliance) distributes new clothing and coats to needy children, women and families in the Greater Williamsport Area. Since November we have distributed 128 coats. If we have hats, gloves and mittens we include them with the coat, but since early December we had all but exhausted our supply of those items.

We are deeply grateful to the members of St. Mark's who answered our request for hats, gloves and

mittens. A total of 29 assorted hats, gloves and mittens were donated.

Going Green for Gifting in 2022!

The Evangelism and Fellowship Committee thanks the congregation for their donations of gift bags, cards, tissue paper, calendars and day planners. The calendars and day planners were shared with the Shepherd of the Streets, Blessing Box at New Covenant UCC, and Daniel's Closet. The gift bags, cards, and wrapping paper will be used for our outreach next December.

Parish Life Activities

Since the beginning of the pandemic, the Parish Life Committee has been sidelined. But feeling the need to get back into the kitchen, this committee is serving in small ways both within the church and out into the community. It is the outreach to the community that needs the congregation's help.

During the winter months when no refrigeration is required, the Blessing Box at New Covenant UCC distributes a dozen sandwiches per day. With the cost of groceries on the rise, you can imagine the expense New Covenant is shouldering. Parish Life has volunteered to provide 24 sandwiches the second and fourth Monday of each winter month. This will provide two days of sandwiches during the respective weeks.

We are in need of monetary donations to cover the costs for meat, cheese, rolls/bread, sandwich bags and individual packets of mayonnaise and mustard. Checks can be made payable to St. Mark's with the memo line indicating Food 4 All.

Sharing in the Caring

Ongoing Collections at St. Mark's:

- United Churches Food Pantry: Needed are boxes of cereal, canned fruit, canned meats, rice, juice and healthy snacks.
- <u>Shepherd of the Streets:</u> Needed are shampoo, conditioner, body wash, deodorant, shave cream and body lotion for

men and women. Also needed are Kleenex and paper towels.

- <u>Blessing Box at New Covenant UCC:</u> Most of the people who use the Blessing Box are homeless or are on extremely tight budgets. Easily prepared foods like Cup of Soups, individual packs of crackers and cookies, microwave mac & cheese, ramen noodles and individual boxes of cereal are needed. Travel size hygiene items and men's socks (new or gently used) are also needed.
- <u>Sojourner Truth Ministries:</u> Spices of all types, Dawn dish detergent, aluminum foil, copper scrubbies and cooking oil are needed.

Donations to the Food Panty, Shepherd of the Streets, the Blessing Box or to Sojourner Truth Ministries may be placed on the tables in the Narthex.

- <u>Daniel's Closet</u> Distribution of free seasonal clothing on Saturday, February 26, 2022 from 8:30 11:00 .m. Winter weather brings the need for warm clothing and sturdier shoes for adults and children. Blankets, bedding, throws and afghans are also accepted.
- Donated Clothing may be dropped off at Redeemer on Thursday, February 10, 2022 from 3:00 – 4:30 PM. <u>This is the same date</u> as the community dinner. If you have a large quantity of clothing that cannot wait until the monthly drop off, please contact Barb Horn at 570-974-3744 to arrange a time to meet at Redeemer Lutheran, 1101 Washington Blvd, Williamsport.

Outreach to Redeemer's Community Dinner

Since the beginning of the pandemic, Redeemer Lutheran has provided a dinner for up to 125 individuals each month. Not only is that a lot of food, but extra expenses are incurred with the need for take-out containers and individual servings of fruit, bread and desserts. St. Mark's provided take-out containers and desserts for several months in 2021. Redeemer has once again requested our help with desserts in 2022.

In January, Parish Life provided brownies for dessert. Parish Life and the Evangelism and Fellowship Committees will provide desserts in February and March. In February we will be providing cakes to be cut and packaged into individual servings. We need nine cakes to provide 125 individual servings. Can you provide a 9 X13 sheet cake? Please contact Becky Miller Pryor at 570-971-4585 if you can donate a cake. The cake and the icing can be any flavor. All cakes must be in our kitchen by Wednesday, February 9, 2022 by 1:00 PM.
