Pastor's "Lion" Message for August, 2022

"I am the living bread that came down from heaven." (John 6:51)

You are what you eat! Do your remember when that saying was all the rage? It's true, not only of the body but also of the soul. If we consume only anger and negativity, we become angry and negative. If we consume only cynicism and sarcasm we become cynics and sarcastic. These feelings and characteristics can poison the heart and shrink the soul. They can and do affect both spiritual and physical health.

As baptized people of the Lord, we are not meant nor made for such things. We are made for "living bread".

The life and words of Jesus, the "Love from on High" who takes human flesh in every act is food for our souls. We need to take it in! We need to be nourished and nurtured in in it-in him! We are to savor his words. We are to fill our bowls and cups of life to the brim with his love.

In word and sacrament we are to eat this bread, this life. We are to feast in and on Christ. We are to see him as the One who provides for us "Holy Sustenance". Jesus is eternal life. He provides us with the morsels of one heavenly food.

We spend so much of our lives, our time, and our money on a thousand things of which we are convinced are important and will make us happy. But as Jesus reminds us, only living bread satisfies the hunger in and of our hearts.



Close to two months ago at a worship gathering for pastors a colleague offered me the bread of holy communion with the words, "The body of Christ given for you. Feed on him."

Jesus is the living bread. The One on whom we feed. The One who freely gives that we may give to others.

Dark color (fast drying if possible)

2 or 3 bath size bars of soap in original wrapping

NO mini or hotel size please


1 adult toothbrush in original package – if you buy a multipack of brushes, place one in a business size envelope and seal

1 sturdy comb – remove packaging NO picks or finetoothed combs

1 metal nail clipper (ones with attached file are OK) – remove packaging

It is that time of the year when we start thinking about the upcoming school year and our outreach to the world through this program.

Although we currently do not have a quilting groups we can send quilts and blankets. The acceptable size is 60"x80". Twin size blankets are also acceptable but no electric blankets, afghans or throws.

Directions for the kits are enclosed. You do not have to purchase all of the items for a kit - there will be a box in the narthex for the items you collect. The bags for the school kits will be available by the end of July. Of course cash donations are always accepted. Please put LWR kits on the memo line of your check. Fabric Kit

2 pieces of cotton or cotton blend fabric (NO knits or 100% polyester) Each piece should match one of the sizes below. Fabrics do not need to match in size, color or pattern.

2 $\frac{1}{2}$ yards of 58"-63" wide OR

3 yards of 42"-45" wide OR

4 yards of 24"-37" wide

2 spools of matching or neutral colored general purpose thread, 250-300 yards long

Fold the thread and one of the pieces of fabric inside the other pieces of fabric and tie with string or yarn.

School Kit

Place the following in the drawstring backpack. Remove all excess packaging.

4 notebooks – 70-80 sheet each, wide or college ruled

NO Loose-leaf paper please

NO composition books

1 ruler – 30 centimeters or a ruler with **centimeters** on one side and inches on the other – plastic, wood, or metal

Ones with just centimeters are OK

1 pencil sharpener

1 pair blunt scissors – safety scissors with embedded steel blade

5 **Unsharpened** #2 pencils secured together with a rubber band

5 black or blue ballpoint pens secured together with a rubber band (no gel pens please)

1 box 16 or 24 crayons

1 eraser 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ inch

Secure by drawing the strings

Baby Care Kit

(sizes newborn to 24 months can be included) Used items in good condition can be used.

2 lightweight cotton T-shirts NO Onesies or snap crotch

2 long or short sleeved gowns or sleepers (NO feet) – pajama sets of top and pants can also be used

2 blankets – medium weight cotton or flannel, or crocheted or knitted with lightweight yarn – 36" to 52" square (no polar fleece)

- 4 cloth diapers. Flat fold preferred
- 1 jacket, sweater or sweatshirt with hood or include a baby cap
- 2 pairs of cotton socks
- 1 hand towel, dark color
- 2 bath size bars of gentle soap in original wrapping

NO mini or hotel size please

2 diaper pins or large safety pins

Secure everything inside one of the blankets and secure with the diaper pins



SAVE THE DATE!

You cordially are invited to the installation of The Reverend Craig A. Miller, recently elected as the Fourth Bishop of the Upper Susquehanna Synod, which will take place on Saturday, September 17, 2:00 PM at Zion Lutheran Church, Sunbury.

This is an exceptional opportunity for members of St. Mark's congregation to witness an important moment in the life of the Church. Pastor Miller will be installed as Bishop by The Reverend Elizabeth A. Eaton, Presiding Bishop of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. Fellow Lutherans from throughout our area will be in attendance, along with clergy (Lutheran and other denominations) who participate in the laying on of hands to bless and to welcome the new Bishop. The Upper Susquehanna Synod is one of only 65 ELCA synods across the nation, and is comprised of 117 Lutheran churches and some 25,000 baptized members.

Please join with Lutherans from throughout the region in welcoming Pastor Miller as the Fourth Bishop. The Rev. Craig A. Miller, Mifflinburg, Pa., was elected June 18 to serve a six-year term as bishop of the Upper Susquehanna Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). The election took place during the synod assembly, June 17-18, at Susquehanna University in Selinsgrove, Pa.

Miller was elected on the fifth ballot, with 103 votes to 91 votes for the Rev. Stina Schaeffer, pastor of Salem Lutheran Church, Selinsgrove.

The bishop-elect has served as assistant to the bishop and director for evangelical mission in the synod since 2016. He served as pastor of Our Saviour's Lutheran Church in Brooklyn, N.Y., from 1996 to 2016.

Miller earned his Bachelor of Science degree from the State University of New York College of Environmental Science and Forestry in Syracuse, N.Y., in 1985 and his Master of Divinity degree from the Lutheran Theological Seminary at Philadelphia (now United Lutheran Seminary) in 1996. United is one of seven ELCA seminaries.


Growing the Church




Building Communities, Strengthening Lives

There is no vacation from hunger. Summertime generally sees an increase of parents with children visiting the charities we support. Please consider looking in your cupboards or purchasing an item to be donated.

Ongoing Collections at St. Mark's

HUNGER NOW United Churches Food Pantry: Items in need are cereal of all kinds, canned goods (meats, vegetables, fruit), cake and brownie mixes and condiments. Boxes of cereal are in high demand.

- <u>Shepherd of the Streets:</u> Items most needed are toilet tissue, paper towels, shampoo and conditioner, deodorant, body wash and shave cream for men and women, disposable razors, toothpaste, toothbrushes for adults and children, dish soap and small packages of laundry pods. Laundry pods are now available at the Dollar Tree.
- <u>Blessing Boxes at New Covenant UCC:</u> Individual healthy snacks and crackers, Cup of Soups, microwave meals, ramen noodles, juice boxes, travel-size hygiene items, combs, toothbrushes, socks (new or gently used) and men's t-shirts (new or gently used in sizes large and extra-large) are needed.
- <u>Sojourner Truth Ministries:</u> Meals are served six days per week. But this ministry is also in need of individual snacks and beverages for folks who need additional food. Some Lego Facts

Ohio. Meeting under the theme "Embody the Word," the assembly will participate in plenary discussions to make decisions about the work of this church. They will also spend time in worship and Bible study.

The triennial gathering — the highest legislative body of the denomination — will be composed of more than 900 voting members serving on behalf of the 3.3 million members of the ELCA.



More than four months after Russian troops invaded Ukraine, fighting continues to intensify and humanitarian conditions continue to deteriorate. The United Nations estimates that at least 24 million people — more than half of Ukraine's population — will need humanitarian assistance in the coming months. In addition to continuing to meet the immediate needs of arriving ref-

ugees, our partners in the region support those fleeing the violence in Ukraine and provide assistance in psychosocial care, pastoral care, housing, job searches, language study, school admission, legal services, cash assistance and other key integration support for individuals and families.
