Nibbles From The Churchmouse


Since Joe said I would be back I am back briefly! Passing on things that I know when folks do not send in their news!



We are coming down to the wire on this project. All kits are due by Sunday, Oct. 2 as they have to be delivered to the gathering site on Sat. Oct. 8. We have at least 60 backpacks out to be filled but there are more of them in the Narthex. There is a display about the LWR and kits in the hallway of the Parish house so you can see where these items go. We still need baby kits, personal care kits and fabric kits. Blankets are also needed, twin size, 60x80 in, cotton, knit or polyester (no polar fleece) Gently used quilts in the correct size can be used. Personal Care Kit

1 light weight bath towel

20" x 40" to 52" x 27"

Dark color (fast drying if possible)

2 or 3 bath size bars of soap in original wrapping

NO mini or hotel size please

1 adult toothbrush in original package – if you buy a multipack of brushes, place one in a business size envelope and seal

1 sturdy comb – remove packaging NO picks or finetoothed combs

1 metal nail clipper (ones with attached file are OK) – remove packaging

Wrap all items in the towel and secure with string, yarn or ribbon.

Fabric Kit

2 pieces of cotton or cotton blend fabric (NO knits or 100% polyester) Each piece should match one of the sizes below. Fabrics do not need to match in size, color or pattern.

2 $\frac{1}{2}$ yards of 58"-63" wide OR

3 yards of 42"-45" wide OR

4 yards of 24"-37" wide

2 spools of matching or neutral colored general purpose thread, 250-300 yards long

Fold the thread and one of the pieces of fabric inside the other pieces of fabric and tie with string or yarn.

School Kit

Place the following in the drawstring backpack. Remove all excess packaging.

4 notebooks – 70-80 sheet each, wide or college ruled

NO Loose-leaf paper please

NO composition books

1 ruler – 30 centimeters or a ruler with **centimeters** on one side and inches on the other – plastic, wood, or metal

Ones with just centimeters are OK

1 pencil sharpener

1 pair blunt scissors – safety scissors with embedded steel blade

5 **Unsharpened** #2 pencils secured together with a rubber band


5 black or blue ballpoint pens secured together with a rubber band (no gel pens please)

1 box 16 or 24 crayons

1 eraser 2 1/2 inch

Secure by drawing the strings

Baby Care Kit

(sizes newborn to 24 months can be included) Used items in good condition can be used.

2 lightweight cotton T-shirts **NO Onesies or snap crotch**

2 long or short sleeved gowns or sleepers (NO feet) – pajama sets of top and pants can also be used

2 blankets – medium weight cotton or flannel, or crocheted or knitted with lightweight yarn – 36" to 52" square (no polar fleece)

- 4 cloth diapers. Flat fold preferred
- 1 jacket, sweater or sweatshirt with hood or include a baby cap
- 2 pairs of cotton socks
- 1 hand towel, dark color
- 2 bath size bars of gentle soap in original wrapping

NO mini or hotel size please

2 diaper pins or large safety pins

Secure everything inside one of the blankets and secure with the diaper pins



SAVE THE DATE!

You cordially are invited to the installation of The Reverend Craig A. Miller, recently elected as the Fourth Bishop of the Upper Susquehanna Synod, which will take place on Saturday, September 17, 2:00 PM at Zion Lutheran Church, Sunbury.

This is an exceptional opportunity for members of St. Mark's congregation to witness an important moment in the life of the Church. Pastor Miller will be installed as Bishop by The Reverend Elizabeth A. Eaton, Presiding Bishop of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. Fellow Lutherans from throughout our area will be in attendance, along with clergy (Lutheran and other denominations) who participate in the laying on of hands to bless and to welcome the new Bishop. The Upper Susquehanna Synod is one of only 65 ELCA synods across the nation, and is comprised of 117 Lutheran churches and some 25,000 baptized members.

Please join with Lutherans from throughout the region in welcoming Pastor Miller as the Fourth Bishop. The Rev. Craig A. Miller, Mifflinburg, Pa., was elected June 18 to serve a six-year term as bishop of the Upper Susquehanna Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). The election took place during the synod assembly, June 17-18, at Susquehanna University in Selinsgrove, Pa.

Miller was elected on the fifth ballot, with 103 votes to 91 votes for the Rev. Stina Schaeffer, pastor of Salem Lutheran Church, Selinsgrove.

The bishop-elect has served as assistant to the bishop and director for evangelical mission in the synod since 2016. He served as pastor of Our Saviour's Lutheran Church in Brooklyn, N.Y., from 1996 to 2016.

Miller earned his Bachelor of Science degree from the State University of New York College of Environmental Science and Forestry in Syracuse, N.Y., in 1985 and his Master of Divinity degree from the Lutheran Theological Seminary at Philadelphia (now United Lutheran Seminary) in 1996. United is one of seven ELCA seminaries.



Evangelism and Fellowship Committee Notes for the Lion, September 2022



Missionary from Liberia

The Reverend Linda Johnson Seyenkulo, our missionary in Liberia and wife of Jensen Seyenkulo, bishop emeritus of the Lutheran Church of Liberia, visited with members of St. Mark's and others from the community in late July. She shared with us her responsibilities in instructing men and women for the ministry and in serving as an assistant pastor for a congregation. Her presentation revealed that

the Lutheran Church in Liberia has been growing steadily in membership for the past several years. It is one of the largest denominations in Liberia. And that due to immediate and stringent regulations for all people the Covid-19 virus did not have the impact on Liberia as it had in our country. Pastor Seyenkulo will continue her ministry in Liberia after visiting with her family in Minnesota.



Sharing in the Caring

September is Hunger Awareness Month. In a recent Facebook post, Sojourner Truth Ministries posted pictures of their food pantry. Their shelves are all but bare. These are the same shelves Chef Dave uses when preparing lunch for 75-100 people six days per week! All non-perishable food donated in September will be taken to Sojourner Truth Ministries for use by Chef Dave and his volunteers. Please consider looking in your cupboards or purchasing an item to be donated.

Ongoing Collections at St. Mark's:

- <u>Sojourner Truth Ministries:</u> This ministry is also in need of individual snacks and beverages for folks who need additional food. Needed are protein bars, packs of peanuts, juice boxes, breakfast bars and individually wrapped snacks. Cooking oil and spices are always needed in the kitchen.
- <u>Shepherd of the Streets:</u> The Shepherd's bins for hygiene items are also all but empty. Items most needed are shampoo and conditioner, deodorant, body wash and shave cream for men and women, dispos-



able razors, toothpaste, toothbrushes for adults and children. Also needed is dish soap and small packages of laundry pods. Laundry pods are now available at the Dollar Tree.

- <u>Blessing Boxes at New Covenant UCC:</u> Individual healthy snacks and crackers, Cup of Soups, microwave meals, ramen noodles, juice boxes, travel-size hygiene items, combs, toothbrushes, socks (new or gently used) and men's t-shirts and hoodies (new or gently used in sizes large and extra-large) are needed.
- Donations to Sojourner Truth Ministries, Shepherd of the Streets or to the Blessing Box may be placed on the tables in the Narthex.



Soda Tabs: Collected to support the Ronald McDonald House in Danville. Containers are in the Narthex and Fellowship Hall. **Pennies for Youth Activities:** A container is available in the Narthex for your donations.


We look forward to sharing this time of fellowship and study and hope to have you join us!


