Pastor's "Lion" Message for November

On Thursday, November 24, our nation will celebrate and observe a National Day of Thanksgiving. One of the hymns associated with this day is, "We Plow the Fields and Scatter" (362, LBW). "We Plow the Fields and Scatter" reminds us that while human beings plow fields and scatter seed, God provides the mystery of growth:

We plow the fields and scatter the good seed on the land,

But it is fed and watered By God's al mighty hand.

Traditional themes associated with harvest and Thanksgiving Day.

The title of the hymn can also provide us with an unfortunate commentary on what Thanksgiving Day has become. Think about it, "We plow the seeds and scatter." Not the scattering of seeds but the scattering of ourselves.

Thanksgiving Day has become the forgotten holiday. Oh we still celebrate it with a long weekend, the gathering of family and a grand and glorious meal, but the real purpose of giving thanks seems to be lost. We don't show up for that. We scatter. Thanksgiving Day is a time not so much to "give thanks" as it is to:

Watch a parade
Sing turkey songs
Eat until you can't eat any more
Begin Christmas Shopping
Watch football games

A National Day of Thanksgiving is to be a day as it's name implies, "To Give Thanks".

Nibbles From The Churchmouse

The mouse wants to remind everybody that he or she is anonymous and would like to remain that way!

As an armchair traveler. I enjoyed reading about Ralph and Lou Ann's travels, so I wanted to share them with you.

Lou Ann and Ralph Zeigler recently traveled to Italy, Austria, and Germany. Highlights included:

Seeing numerous cathedrals and churches, including the Duomo in Milan (Europe's 2nd largest cathedral); St. John the Baptist Cathedral in Turin (which houses the Shroud of Turin, believed to be the burial cloth that covered the body of Christ as He was laid in the tomb); and several very opulent Austrian and German baroque and rococo churches.

Visiting the charming cities of Innsbruck (twice host to the winter Olympics) and Salzburg, Austria, where a Mozart dinner concert was enjoyed at St. Peter's Abbey, an inn dating back to 803 A.D. Castles and forts throughout the region (including several from the 13th and 14th centuries) serve to remind of Europe's incredible history.

Experiencing the "Passion Play" in Oberammergau, Germany. The five-hour play (with a dinner intermission) has been performed by town residents since 1634, when survivors of the bubonic plague promised to tell the story of Christ's Passion every decade if they would be spared from further death. They were, and their promise has been kept since.

Enjoying the food and celebrating Oktoberfest (dating back to the early 1800s) in Munich, Germany, as well as appreciating some of that city's rich culture and landmarks (the town square glockenspiel among them).

Returning with lots of memories and enjoying new experiences, they agreed that it is nice to be traveling again!

What is most important about Thanksgiving Day? Gathering of family? The history associated with it? The turkey dinner? No, the giving of thanks! The name says it all! The Evangelism and Fellowship Committee will provide Thanksgiving cards on Sunday, November 13,

Later this month we will be collecting items to gift the seventeen ladies of CM-6 at the <u>Selinsgrove Center</u>. We will be collecting extra-moisturizing body wash, non-refrigerated pudding cups in a variety of flavors and pairs of slipper socks so every lady can receive a pair or two. We will also gift the caregivers

with treats. Later this month we will learn if an in-person party will occur. Regardless of that decision, our gifts will be delivered. Monetary gifts are always welcomed. Checks may be made payable to St. Mark's with the memo line indicating the Selinsgrove Party.

We will also collect general gifts for the residents (consumers) of the <u>Danville State Hospital</u>. Those gifts include the following items in sizes Large and XLG for men and women.




