

# Pastor's "Lion" Message for January 2023

Dear Members and Friends of St. Mark's, On Friday, January 6 the church celebrates the Epiph-

any of Our Lord, the adoration of the Christ Child by the Magi (Wise Men).

The Epiphany is a celebration that has much to teach us:

Historically it is "older" than the celebration of Christmas. Epiphany celebrations date to the third century; Christmas celebrations to the fourth century. When we combine the two (include the wise men the night Jesus is born) we muddy the waters of Christ's coming and cloud the meaning of both Christmas and Epiphany.

The birth of Jesus is announced by a star which the wise men see and follow. Only the magi, not Herod, not Herod's wise men, not the shepherds, see the star. An indication that the Holy Spirit leads us to look for Jesus? The star, like the angel in the Christmas story, is God's "birth announcement".

#### Pastor's "Lion" Message for January 2023 (continued)

Jesus is Savior and Lord of all people. The wise men are Gentiles (non-Jews). Jesus has come for all men, women and children.

The gifts of the wise men, and by the way there are three gifts not necessarily three wise men, are not mere trinkets. They symbolize who Jesus is and proclaim what he brings.

**Gold:** Jesus is a King who reigns over a kingdom. This kingdom Jesus brings among us.

**Frankincense:** Jesus is Emmanuel. Frankincense was used as incense to welcome God.

**Myrrh:** Jesus is sacrifice for our sins. Myrrh was used in embalming. A reminder that Jesus will die and rise again.

The Epiphany helps to put Christmas into focus. It proclaims that the baby Jesus of Bethlehem is the Christ who brings us salvation. The Epiphany leads us forth into a new calendar year filled with possibilities and helps us face the future unafraid. God is with us and made manifest among us (manifestation is the meaning of the Greek word, epiphany)!

Happy Epiphany! Happy 2023!

## Thank You for the Christmas Gifts



The Evangelism and Fellowship Committee thanks the congregation for their support of their many December projects. Without your support we could not have been the hands of God at this very special time of year.

During December the Evangelism and Fellowship Committee, with assistance from the congregation, accomplished the following outreach:

One hundred thirty-nine assorted clothing items, hygiene items, fleece throws,

*or your Kindness* watches and batteries were donated to the residents of the Danville State Hospital. The committee is grateful for Tracy Fox of Redeemer Lutheran for transporting our items along with Redeemer's to Danville.

- Donations of body wash, slipper socks and pudding cups for the seventeen ladies of CM-6 at the Selinsgrove Center were donated. A snack basket was prepared for their caregivers. Due to ongoing health concerns for a third year, we were unable to sing and tell stories to the ladies. The staff was grateful for our gifts and hope 2023 will be the year we can return in person.
- On December 9, 2022 we hosted a Red Cross Blood Drive in Fellowship Hall. Twenty-one units of blood were collected including donations from Matt and Wanda Fortin. We are tentatively scheduled to host blood drives on July 14 and December 8, 2023.
- Thank you to the members of the congregation who took Christmas cards from the table in the Narthex, added a cheery message and mailed them to our Special Concerns Folks and others we do not see as often as we would like.
- The felt pinecones and Polish stars crafted by Lou Ann Zeigler brought joy to many. To date \$180.00 has been donated. That joy, given as \$15 grocery gift cards, will be shared with clients of the United Churches Food Pantry.
- The Faith Formation and Evangelism and Fellowship Committees thank the congregation for participating in Reverse Advent. As of press time the Advent bags were being returned filled with nonperishable food items and hygiene products.

These gestures of Christmas spirit given by members of our congregation were certain to comfort the individuals receiving them in Christ's name
