Pastor's "Lion" message for May God has gone up with a shout! (Psalm 47:5)

Thursday, May 18, the church celebrates Ascension Day. Ascension Day remembers Jesus ascending into heaven forty days after Easter Sunday. Ascension Day concludes the Easter Season and reminds us that the Day of Pentecost (May 25, 2023), which begins a new church season, will soon be upon us.

The Ascension is one of those events in the life of Christ that often becomes an after thought. I suspect this is true for two reasons:

- 1. It is commemorated on a Thursday and not on a Sunday. Forty days since Easter Sunday in 2023 is Thursday, May 18.
- 2. As described in Luke 24:44-53 (the disciples were told to wait for the power from on high), ascension is a "waiting event". We conclude waiting means not a lot of activity.

The church has let itself be influenced by society on these two fronts. Easter has become known as a day and not a season. Waiting is looked upon as "doing nothing".

Ascension can help us in our understanding regarding life in the church. Easter is a season, not only a day. Waiting involves prayer, study, fellowship, contemplation; clearly not "doing nothing".

Ascension asks us to behold Jesus as God in the flesh. He is the God who dwells with us. touches the earth with divine splendor, comforts us, brings us forgiveness and new life, and at the same time, dwells on high.

I pray that we will not neglect this wonderful and awe-inspiring day which helps keep our feet on the ground while our lives remain focused on Christ, who dwells on high yet is ever with us.

New Business:

- Suggestion of 12% rent increase (or \$168/month) for Little Lambs expanded space in Parish Hall.

The appraisal process for St. Mark's is on a 5 year cycle. We need to obtain a physical appraisal (or a "hard cycle appraisal") which will run several thousand dollars. **This appraisal needs someone to be in charge of collecting the needed information (including capital improvements) and to fill out the necessary forms. Jackie Baysore can help with this process. After this is done, appraisals for the following years will run about \$300.00. This appraisal process has already been set in motion through past council action.

Blessing Box Bath Kits

During Lent, bath kits were assembled for Lutheran World Relief for distribution in Turkey. Thank you, Deb Buckman for spearheading this much needed project. The Faith Formation and Evangelism and Fellowship Committees are joining together to continue a similar project much closer to home. The Blessing Boxes at New Covenant UCC give bath kits to homeless people who stop by for nourishment and hygiene items.

The foundation of each kit is a bath towel and washcloth which our committees will provide. But we will need assistance from congregation members for additional items to complete each kit. Our goal is to complete ten kits by May.

Items in need are bars of soap, plastic soap dishes, toothbrushes, toothpaste, toothbrush holders, bandaids, inexpensive combs and brushes and small bottles of body lotion. Items can be found inexpensively at the Dollar Tree, Dollar General, Family Dollar or Wal-Mart. Donations may be placed in the tub in the Narthex. Thank you for any assistance you can give.

Rise Up Village Bakery

What is our mission? Why do a dozen people spend Mondays baking at New Covenant United Church of Christ? Who are we?

The mission of the Rise Up Village Bakery is to provide training in baking skills and to offer support and guidance for individuals involved with the criminal justice system. Our vision for the graduates of our program is that they will be able to secure gainful employment and be restored to the community. We are volunteers who work alongside the trainees. We share love by serving others.

Trainee referrals come from local agencies. As people transition out of the program, we are always looking for new candidates. Volunteers are also needed to work in the kitchen and in the "front of the house" with labeling and packaging. Please spread the word about our program and our need for participants, both trainees and volunteers.

Currently there are 122 people on our weekly mailing list. The orders for baked goods are often as much as 30 loaves of bread, 100 rolls, 80 muffins and over 60 dozen cookies. On Mondays we start baking at 8:00 a.m. and orders can be picked up between 2:00 and 4:00 p.m. We have become a "well oiled machine" and have learned how to "dance" around each other in the kitchen!
