Pastor's "Lion" Message for September, 2023

They exchanged the glory of God for the image of an ox that eats grass (Ps. 106.20)

Verse 20 of Psalm 106 recalls the story of how the Israelites molted a golden calf from the jewelry they plundered from their slave masters when they left Egypt (Exodus 32 and Deuteronomy 4). When Moses came down from Mount Sinai with the Ten Commandments he found them dancing around this idol and offering it sacrifice.

The Israelites were set free by the Lord. Through Moses God led the Hebrew peoples to freedom. Instead of rejoicing in their deliverance however, rather quickly they turned their backs on God and began to forget all the Lord's benefits.

The ancient Israelites were not the only ones to forget about God's love and all that God provides. There are golden calves in the 21st century. Idols to which we bow and to which we claim absolute allegiance. Golden calves are anything that separate us from



Lutheran FABRIC KIT

World Relief • 2 pieces of cotton or cotton blend fabric (NO knits or 100% polyester). Each piece should match on of the sizes below. Fabrics do not need to match in size, color or pattern.

2 1/2 yards of 58"-63" wide OR

3 yards of 42"-45" wide OR

4 yards of 24"-37" wide

- 2 spools of matching or neutral colored general purpose thread, 250-300 yards long.
- Fold the thread and one of the pieces of fabric and tie with string or yarn.

PERSONAL CARE KIT

- 1 light weight bath towel 20" x 40" to 52" x 27" Dark color (fast drying if possible).
- 2 bath size bars of soap in original wrapping. NO mini or hotel size please.
- 1 adult toothbrush in original package if you buy a multipack of brushes, place one in a business size envelope and seal.
- 1 sturdy comb remove packaging. NO picks or fine-toothed combs.
- 1 metal nail clipper (ones with attached file are OK) - remove packaging.
- Wrap all items in the towel and secure with string or yarn or ribbon.



BABY CARE KIT

Sizes newborn to 24 months can be included

Used items in good condition can be used

2 lightweight cotton T-shirts. NO onesies or snap crotch

2 long or short sleeved gowns or sleepers (NO feet) - pajama sets of top and pants can also be used.

2 blankets - medium weight cotton or flannel, or crocheted or knitted with lightweight yarn - 36" to 52" square

4 cloth diapers. Fold flat preferred.

1 jacket, sweater or sweatshirt with hood or include a baby cap.

2 pairs of cotton socks.

1 hand towel, dark color.

2 bath size bars of gentle soap in original wrapping. NO mini or hotel size please.

2 diaper pins or large safety pins.

Secure everything inside one of the blankets and secure with the diaper pins.

SCHOOL KITS

Place the following in the drawstring backpack. Remove all excess packaging. No rubber bands.

4 notebooks - 70 to 80 sheets each, wide or college ruled. NO loose-leaf paper please. No composition books.

1 ruler - 30 centimeters or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other. Plastic, wood or metal.

1 pencil sharpener

1 pair of blunt scissors - safety scissors with embedded steel blade 5 unsharpened #2 pencils secured together with a rubber band.

5 black or blue ballpoint pens secured together with a rubber band. NO gel pens please.

1 box 16 or 24 crayons.

1 eraser - 2 1/2 inches.

Secure by drawing the string on the backpack.
