Pastor's "Lion" Message for December, 2023 He who sings, prays twice (Augustine, Bishop of Hippo, 4th century)

Several pastorates ago the church's director of music approached me to preside at a "Worship Service of Music". Her idea was to have music- instrumental and vocal- dominate everything, including the singing of a hymn as the sermon. "Everything", I asked? "Everything", was her response. "The message will be in the music". A novel idea and one that the congregation thoroughly en-

joyed. On that Sunday the gospel was proclaimed in words set to music. It was an "English version" of Luther's "Chorale Mass".

Sometimes in the life of the church we don't pay attention to what we are singing. We concentrate only on the melody and not the words. With that in mind I ask us to consider the words of all the Christmas carols we will be singing during the Christmas season. They are more than just familiar songs that we love to sing. Most of them are the truth of the nativity set to music and thus proclaim the gospel.

Do you have a favorite Christmas Carol? Mine is *Hark! The Herald Angles Sing. It is my favorite primarily because of the words of the third stanza:*

Hail the heav'n born Prince of Peace! Hail the sun of righteousness! Light and life to all he brings, Ris'n with healings in his wings. Mild he lays his glory by, Born that we no more may die, Born to raise each child of earth, Born to give us second birth. Hark! The herald angles sing, "Glory to the newborn king!"

C. Wesley, 1707-1788 (LBW, 60)

In stanza three we have the truth of the gospel revealed to us in verse set to a rousing melody. Jesus is the Prince of Peace who brings forgiveness, new life and life eternal! To sing these words is to proclaim the message of the Christian faith in song!

As you sing familiar carols and songs of Christmas in this Christmas season, whether it be in our worship assembly or in some other setting, pay attention to the words. Meditate on what they are saying. Consider the truth they profess! You too can be an "evangelist in song" and provide "message in your music".




Dear St. Mark's Church Family,

Ralph Zeigler led us in opening prayer.

Secretary's roll call was taken.

Present: Debra Buckman, Ed Gair, Vicki Haussmann, Ray Huff, Nikki Jackson, Herb Poff, Helen Schramm, Mel Wentzel, Glenn Yaple, Ralph Zeigler, Pastor Vasey Absent (excused): Shelby Weber

President's remarks:

- Appreciation for all that continues to be done in and around St. Mark's.
- Please submit committee summaries for the Annual Report to Joe ASAP.

Secretary's Report: The secretary's report for the month of September was approved.

Treasurer's Report: The treasurer's report for the month of October (printed 11/11/2023) was accepted and filed for audit.

- \$30,000.00 was transferred from investments to help pay bills.
- Debra Buckman reviewed several key points of the proposed 2024 budget.
 - Income/Pledges for 2024 stand at \$162,420.00 at this point in time. It seems
 that not all pledges were returned so this number may be budgeted on the
 lower side.
 - Expenses include small raises to our secretary, bookkeeper, organist, and Pastor.
 There were other adjustments made to committee budgets as well.
- The question "How can we do stewardship better?" was posed and discussed.
 - Set a date for our 2024 stewardship campaign in January.
 - Personal contact ~ "Pony Express", phone call, letter.
 - Multiple Temple Talks (perhaps up to 3).
 - Revisit Consecration Sunday.
- **-M(Finance Committee) SC: CC: 23.11.1** Motion approved to accept the 2024 budget and present it to the congregation for congregational approval at the annual congregational meeting to be held December 10, 2023.

Pastor's report: As submitted by Pastor Vasey.

- Noted the synod office has moved to the Milton Lutheran Parish. However, continue using Box 36, Lewisburg, PA 17837 for a mailing address, and info@uss-elca.org as the email address.
- October Mid-Week Bible study was well received.
- Synod Assembly will be held June 14-15, 2024.
- Installation of elected Council Members will take place on Sunday January 7th at both worship services.

- A pinhole leak in one of the basement pipes was recently fixed.

- Will begin to meet quarterly with next meeting to take place in December.

Worship and Music: Updated provided by Ray Huff

- Many dates and times were outlined for worship opportunities in December.
- 6 1/2 inch poinsettias in red and white will be available to order for \$8.00.
- Information from Parsons Pipe Organ Builders was presented and reviewed. 5 repairs are suggested with 3 of these projects considered to be most pressing at this point in time.
 - The cost for these 3 repairs is \$43,600.00. Options for obtaining these monies may include a designated offering specifically for organ repairs and/or looking at several bequests that have been left specifically to be used for music at St. Mark's.
- Question proposed: should we reconsider installing a humidification system to help maintain the leather reservoirs for the organ?
- M(Worship and Music Committee) SC: CC: 23.11.2 Motion approved to coordinate the dorsal and organ process by holding services in the chapel while the work is being done.

- Spire Update: Waiting on a proposal.
- **Dossal Update:** Lundy's Construction is able to install the new dossal. Working on finding fireproof fabric.
- Industrial Appraisal Co./Revaluation Services: Deb Buckman and Nikki Jackson continue to work on gathering information regarding an appraisal.
 - Mutual Inspections Bureau out of Harrisburg is another company who does appraisals. *We can also hire someone local to complete a comprehensive appraisal if needed.
 - It was noted that after talking to St. Mark's insurance company, it is not a necessity to have a comprehensive appraisal done. However, it does provide an in-depth cost analysis of all the items St. Mark's owns.
 - It was noted that it would be worthwhile to review the scheduled items found on our current insurance policy. This could be a possible starting point for the comprehensive appraisal.

New Business:

- Information is available concerning the purchase of a video streaming/recording system from Gelnett and Associates, Northumberland at a cost of \$22,533.00
- A meeting will be held after late service on Nov. 19 to review this information, see video feed of how this system would work, and discuss if this is a route St. Mark's should consider.

M(Worship and Music Committee) SC: CC: 23.11.3 Motion approved to send organ repair proposal to the congregation via the December Annual Meeting. Repairs to the organ will be performed by Parsons Pipe Organ Builders, Canandaigua, NY at a cost approximate to \$43,600.00. Options for obtaining these monies may include a designated offering specifically for organ repairs and/or available bequests.

Ralph Zeigler.led us in the closing prayer. The meeting was adjourned.



so the guests can cook for themselves, or you can do take out or delivery from a restaurant. If you are willing to provide a meal, please let me know




