Pastor's "Lion" Message for February, 2024

Pastor

On Wednesday, February 14 we begin the Season of Lent. Lent is the time of six weeks before Easter. It commemorates the time of Jesus' suffering, death and crucifixion before he victoriously rises from the dead. Sundays during this season are called "Sundays in Lent" rather than "Sundays of Lent". The reason for this is that every Sunday, regardless of the church season in which it falls, is a "mini-Easter". Sundays remind us that Jesus rose from the dead on "the third day" following his death.

This year, in addition to the Sunday services and traditional somber tone of Lent, St. Mark's will observe the Lenten Season with a detailed study of Holy Week. This study, based upon the Passion from the Gospel according to Mark and ideas put forward in the book, The Last Week, by Marcus Borg and John Dominic Crossan, will bring us face to face with issues facing Jesus' during his last week on earth. Borg and Crossan seek to lead us through what can often be a complicated maze of the Holy Week

Accompany Jesus through Holy Week and gain a fresh perspective for Mark's account and the way of the cross in which Jesus walked.

The Gospel According to Mark 2004 Lenten Bible Study

The Faith Formation Committee will offer Bible study from the Gospel of St. Mark during Wednesday in Lent. Mark offers a day-by-day account of Holy Week from Palm Sunday to Easter morning. One resource we consulted, which studies Mark's account, is *The Last Week:What the Gospels Really Teach About Jesus's Final Days in Jerusalem*, by Marcus J. Borg and John Dominic Crossan (Harper, 2006).

The writers say their purpose is "to tell and explain, against the background of Jewish high-priestly collaboration with Roman imperial control, the last week of Jesus' life on earth ...as given in the Gospel of St. Mark." (viii) Thus, the authors see social justice as Mark's theme: Jesus and the Kingdom of God are to be understood primarily in terms of non-violent resistance


to the "domination systems" (like Rome) that create and "legitimize" injustice (like Jerusalem high-priest, elders and scribes). For example, the story of the Widow's Mite is interpreted not as the widow giving all she has to God, but as indictment of the Temple authorities for exploiting the poorest Jews. Many traditional concepts such as "atonement" and "sacrifice", get new interpretations: "Jesus did not die *for* the sins of the world...he was killed *because* of the sins of the world..." (162) "The political meaning of Good Friday and Easter sees the human problem as injustice and the solution as God's justice. (211) Because mark ends his Easter account with no physical appearances of Jesus, Borg and Crossan downplay a physical resurrection in favor of a transformed Jesus who leads us to a transformational resurrection of our own as we continue Jesus's work to establish the Kingdom of God against the "domination systems" of this world.

Whether or not one accepts this reading of Mark (I was skeptical), the authors offer many insights to the historical situation, for example the importance of the Temple in Jewish life, and they bring out the connections between Jesus's words and the Hebrew Scriptures, as Jesus's references to the "Son of Man" and the visions in Daniel. Comparisons with other Biblical accounts of Holy Week are also enlightening.

Our Lenten Bible study is based on Mark, not this book, buy we can use some of its interpretations as points for discussion. A copy of the book will be available for anyone who wants to try it.

All are welcome! The study begins Wednesday, February 21, 2024 at 12:10PM in Fellowship Hall and concludes Wednesday, March 20th.




