Pastor's Lion Message for April 2025

Galatians 6:14

*But God forbid that I should boast except
in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ...*

On Friday, April 18, 2025, the church (people of God) will observe "Good Friday". The date of Good Friday, the annual commemoration of Jesus' crucifixion before Easter Sunday, varies. It is calculated by way of the date of the Paschal Full Moon (the first full moon after the spring equinox) and always falls between March 22 and April 25. In past years St. Mark's has observed Good Friday by way of a "Tenebrae, the Service of Shadows". This year our Worship and Music Committee offers "something different", a drama within a worship service entitled, "The Temptation of Jesus".

"The Temptation of Jesus", by The Rev. Curt M. Joseph, imagines a conversation between Jesus and Satan while Jesus is being crucified. The character of Satan "tries his best" to convince Jesus to come down from the cross and end his suffering and execution. Jesus remains steadfast and answers the devil's temptation with the traditional seven last words from the cross. The drama's mes-

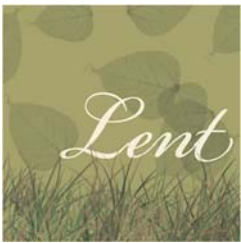

St. Mark's Council meeting- March 17, 2025

Call to Order: 6:00 pm

Council recited the Defining Mission Statement

Wanda Fortin led the opening prayer

CC2025.03.01. (Todd/Reitz) Helen Schramm requested to resign her council seat. Adopted.

Vicki read a warm "thank you" note from Jane Larson. She and her fellow residents are deeply grateful for Pastor Vasey's worship services at the Williamsport Home Independent Living facility.

Minutes of the February meeting were reviewed and approved as submitted.

Deb Buckman delivered the Treasurer's Report. The report was accepted and filed for audit.

CC2025.03.02. (Huff/Fortin) Approve the email vote giving the property committee approval to proceed with repairs to the boiler at an estimated cost of \$3,600.00 and to replace the third of three circulator pumps at an estimated cost of \$4,000.00. Adopted.

Pastor's Report: Pastor gave an update on the Camp Mt. Luther Campaign. Due to supplies, the cost of the bath house will be around \$40,000.00 over the estimate. We received a citation from CML for Faithfulness to Pledge. Acknowledgment of this will be given on Sunday, April 27.

We will have a Good Friday drama on April 18. It will be different and worthwhile!

There will be a Good Friday service from 12:00-3:00. The planning is continuing for the site at a local church.

The Evangelism and Fellowship Committee wish to extend heartfelt thanks and appreciation to the congregation for their generous support of Code Blue at First Church, Redeemer Lutheran's community dinner, Sojourner Truth Ministries and New Covenant UCC in conjunction with the Office of Community Service at Lycoming College.



We were able to deliver more than 600 individually packaged snacks and \$100 in Wegman's gift cards to John and Sue Best, coordinators at Code Blue. We were also able to deliver 120 servings (20 boxes) of TastyKakes to Redeemer Lutheran. - The Parish Life and Evangelism and Fellowship Committees make sandwiches for New Covenant UCC's Blessing Boxes on these dates in April: April 2, 14, 16, 28 and 30. Please join us at 9:00 AM on one of these dates if you would like to help assemble sandwiches.

- The above committees are always in need of supplies like rolls, bread, meat and cheese. Speak to Becky Miler Pryor if you can donate an item on one of the dates in March.
- Monetary donations can also be donated to cover expenses related to this outreach. Checks may be made payable to St. Mark's with the memo line indicating Parish Life.



Ongoing Collections at St. Mark's:
