Pastor's Lion Message for May 2025

And when Jesus had said these things, as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. And while they were gazing into heaven as he went, behold two men stood by them in white robes, and said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking into heaven? This same Jesus who was taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way you saw him go into heaven (Acts 1:9-11)."

On Thursday, May 29 the church celebrates Ascension Day. Ascension Day commemorates Jesus' return to heaven 40 days after the resurrection. Contrary to Hollywood and popular opinion, Jesus did not rise and ascend on the same day. That is one of the reasons why Easter is looked upon as a season lasting seven weeks- it's biblical.

Ascension is important to commemorate and celebrate in the life of the church for seven reasons (and not just because 7 is one of those biblical numbers):

- 1. It signals the end of Jesus' earthly ministry; the Son returns to the Father.
- 2. It symbolizes victory. All that Jesus had come to do has been accomplished.
- 3. It marks the return of Jesus' heavenly

- 5. It affirms Jesus preparing a place for us.
- 6. It inaugurates Jesus' role as high priest.
- 7. It sets the pattern for Jesus' return

Ascension Day presents the opportunity to acknowledge that our faith is not in "a man" but in the "Son of God". It reminds us who is in charge and how our God is not limited by time and space. It further constitutes that because our struggle is not against flesh and blood our victory over death and all evil is not a hollow one. Jesus is our champion. Jesus is our victorious Savior and Lord who reigns from on high throughout all eternity. The Ascension proclaims that Christ is all and in all.

Celebrate our Lord's Ascension and give glory to God now and always as it proclaims our God reigns!





We Care for Families

During May and June, when we celebrate Mother's Day and Father's Day, the Evangelism and Fellowship Committee asks that you consider donating hygiene items that are of tremendous help to families with children. We are requesting baby shampoo, baby lotion, baby/kids body wash, baby wipes, tissues and kids' toothbrushes and toothpaste. The Dollar Stores have these items at reasonable prices. Items will be given to the Shepherd of the Streets and may be placed on the table in the Narthex Closet. Thank you in advance for any help that you can give.

Spring Cleaning? Redecorating? Moving? Got Stuff?

The Evangelism and Fellowship Committee and the Women of St. Mark's still need donations for our annual Fall Sale that is tentatively scheduled for September 12 and 13. If you are discovering items, you no longer need or want, please donate them to us. We are accepting holiday decorations, housewares, linens, toys, small, working electronics, gadgets, dishes, jewelry, lamps, art work and the list goes on.



We <u>cannot</u> accept VCR tapes, text books, encyclopedias, computers, televisions, large gym equipment, broken items, cribs or mattresses.

Please place your donations in boxes small enough for us to carry. Donations can be placed in the Bazaar Room in the basement. If you cannot get to the basement, leaving them on the second landing in the back stairwell is helpful. Extra boxes for your convenience are available in the Bazaar Room.

Ongoing Collections at St. Mark's:



<u>United Churches Food Pantry:</u> Any non-perishable food item is always needed. But the following items are **most needed** at this time. Small bags of sugar, ground coffee, canned tuna, Pop Tarts, salt and pepper sets, mayonnaise.

Shepherd of the Streets: See the article **We Care for Families**.

- <u>Blessing Boxes at New Covenant UCC:</u> Easily prepared foods like Cup of Soups, individual packs of crackers and cookies, microwave mac & cheese, ramen noodles and individual boxes of cereal are needed. Travel size hygiene items are also needed.
- <u>Summer Blessing Box Needs:</u> With summer temperatures it is difficult to provide our usual meat and cheese sandwiches. The Parish Life and Evangelism and Fellowship Committees are asking for two specific donations. They are Star-Kist Deli Style Tuna Salad and Star-Kist Chicken Salad. Both come in a foil packet and are ready to eat. These items are able to resist spoiling due to extreme temperatures. A container is available in the Narthex for these specific items.
- <u>Sojourner Truth Ministries (STM):</u> Air Freshener (light scents,) sugar, mayonnaise, ketchup, and large lunch bags.
- Donations to the Food Panty, Shepherd of the Streets, the Blessing Boxes or to Sojourner Truth Ministries may be placed on the tables in the Narthex.

- <u>Community Dinner</u> on <u>Thursday, May 8, 2025</u> beginning at 5:00 p.m. until all meals are distributed. This is a take-out meal available at the curb. All are welcome.

If you can provide a dozen or two of homestyle cookies (any kind), please have them in the church kitchen on Wednesday, May 7. Our local super markets have a good assortment of this type of cookie at a reasonable price.

- <u>Daniel's Closet</u> Distribution of free spring/summer clothing on Saturday, May 24, 2025 from 8:30 11:00 a.m. In addition to clean, spring and summer clothing in good condition, shoes for men, women and children are always needed. Sheets, blankets, throws and afghans are also accepted.
