Pastor's Lion Message for June 2025

Pastor's "Lion" Message June, 2025 *In distress you called, and I rescued you (Psalm 81:7)*

A quick reading of biblical history might cause us to conclude, "You know those Israelites were truly a fickle people. Look at the evidence:

- God delivered them from slavery, yet their gratitude was short-lived
- Moses went to the mountain to receive the 10 Commandments and in his absence the people started to worship a pagan god.
- God delivered them from their enemies the Philistines, and they forgot God's generosity and began to adopt Philistine traditions.

Some People of God"!

Before we rush to judgment though, I would urge us to exercise caution. As people of God today we need to ask ourselves could we be guilty of some of the same things. What idols have we subtly slid into place on the altars of our hearts? True, we have not sinned in the same detail as Israel's sins, but we have sinned as they have sinned. It's the old truth of our faith: Scripture doesn't teach us that we have sinned *because* Adam and





Right now there is a full house - 4 families - but this is subject to change. St. Mark's is also responsible for providing items for breakfast and lunches. If you wish to donate for this expense (or better yet, volunteer to do that shopping) you can place your check in an envelope and mark it for Family Promise hosting. Minutes

St. Mark's Council meeting- May 19, 2025

Call to Order: 6:00 pm

Council recited the Defining Mission Statement

Deb Buckman narrated a timely story for us.

Secretary's roll call:

Members present: Debra Buckman, Cathy Fenderson, Vicki Haussmann, Ray Huff, Cindy Todd, Lou Ann Zeigler, Wanda Fortin, Donna Clark, Nikki Jackson, Richard Miller, Richard Reitz, Pastor Vasey

Ralph Zeigler gave the presentation of the Worship and Music Committee's recommendation for the proposed dossal and orphrey. This presentation was the result of five years of exhausting research by Ralph, Lou Ann, and the committee.

WM2025.05.01 The Worship and Music Committee recommends that we proceed with the dossal project as follows:

- That we contact A. T. Merhaut (Allison Park, PA) to draft contracts: (1) for dossal fabric from arte/grossè (Belgium company) in the "Saxony" pattern in deep red color, to reupholster the 21 panels comprising the current dossal, and (2) for the fabrication of the orphrey from Slabbinck (Belgium company) in Terlenka blue fabric with a decorative band (#3364) in the middle with the option of decorative galloons along the sides of the orphrey.
- That we contact A. T. Merhaut to determine whether the fabric (through the manufacturing process) meets any of the fire codes that may satisfy local requirements.
- That we contact Lundy Construction Company (Williamsport) to draft a contract based upon their recommendation for the removal of the current 21 dossal panels so that they may be properly reupholstered and then reinstalled to creates the new dossal, and to install the orphrey.

Council Minutes Continued

- That we contact The Barn Fabric Center (Williamsport) to draft a contract based upon their current recommendations for the fireproofing (if necessary) of the new dossal fabric and the proper reupholstering of the 21 dossal panels. ADOPTED.

Minutes of the April meeting were reviewed and approved as submitted.

Deb Buckman delivered the Treasurer's Report. The report was accepted and filed for audit.

Pastor's Report: We had nine services at St. Mark's during Holy Week. Pastor remarked on the three Synod Initiative (Allegheny, Upper and Lower Susquehanna) for the "Go Tell it in the Mountains."

All statistical reports have been completed.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Evangelism and Fellowship: We will be hosting supper one night for VBS. Cereal Sunday, Blood drive in the fall, and 4th of July celebration.

Faith Formation: Next meeting- May 6 @ 10:45 am. The May book study will centers on the novel *Joshua*. The church picnic will be in Fellowship Hall on July 13. Next meeting: June 12.

Finance: Deb Buckman presented the report. Insurance rates have increased.

CC 2025.05.02 Little Lambs: (Todd/Huff) Wanda Fortin resigned from Little Lambs and Donna Clark volunteered to assume the role. Adopted.

Property: Deb Buckman presented the report. Spring cleaning will also include a dumpster for items that are no longer needed.

For food insecure families with children there is no vacation from hunger during the summer months. With schools no longer serving breakfast or lunch, a family's food budget is stretched even tighter. We can help ease that burden. In addition to non-perishable food items being donated to

the United Churches Food Pantry, the Evangelism and Fellowship Committee is designating the second Sunday of June, July, August and September to collecting boxes of cereal of any kind and in any size including the double boxes from Sam's Club. Donations will be given to the United Churches Food Pantry and any single-serve boxes will be given to the Blessing Boxes at New Covenant UCC. Donations may be placed in the tub in the Narthex. <u>United Churches Food Pantry:</u> Any non-perishable food item is always needed. But the following items are most needed at this time. Small bags of white and brown sugar, wide
egg noodles, canned corn, canned hams, Spam, cans of pork and beans, chunky soups, shrimp ramen noodles and salt and pepper sets.

Shepherd of the Streets: See the article We Care for Families.

- <u>Blessing Boxes at New Covenant UCC</u>: Easily prepared foods like Cup of Soups, individual packs of crackers and cookies, microwave mac & cheese, ramen noodles and individual boxes of cereal are needed. Travel size hygiene items are also needed.
- <u>Summer Blessing Box Needs</u>: With summer temperatures it is difficult to provide our usual meat and cheese sandwiches. The Parish Life and Evangelism and Fellowship Committees are asking for two specific donations. They are Star-Kist Deli Style Tuna Salad and Star-Kist Chicken Salad. Both come in a foil packet and are ready to eat. These items are able to resist spoiling due to extreme temperatures. A container is available in the Narthex for these specific items.
- **Sojourner Truth Ministries (STM):** Air Freshener (light scents,) sugar, mayonnaise, ketchup, and large size lunch bags.
