

Pastor's Lion Message for August 2025

Pastor's "Lion" Message August, 2025

Be still and know that I am God (Psalm 46:10)

Many, many years ago I played trumpet in my high school band. I admit I spent more time with my friends rather than taking time to practice. The name of our band director was Chuck Falconio (he encouraged us to call him "Falcon"). A very nice man who had a passion for the band and the students. Falcon had a favorite saying he would invoke whenever he felt the band got a little too rowdy. "Oh, be still! Don't start! Listen!"

His words remind me often of the admonition of Psalm 46:10, "Be still and know that I am God."

As I look over the lessons appointed for Sundays during the month of August, the words of Psalm 46:10 as well as the direction of my high school band director, seem to be a recurring theme: Be still! Settle down! Take the time to listen to God. Often when we call ourselves people of God we associate that identity with taking action because we already know what God asks of us:

Communication skill experts tell us time and time again effective communication includes listening. Not just hearing, taking time to understand what another is saying. The same is true and even more so with God. To be people of God involves listening.

Remind yourself of your baptism. Let God speak. Often we say to ourselves and others, "I know exactly what God means; what God says", when in truth we are only attune to our own voices. An example of this is the phrase, "God helps them who help themselves." It sounds scriptural doesn't it? It's not. The phrase is not found in the bible. God encourages listening and trusting God's grace, not self-sufficiency.

There are a few precious weeks left to celebrate summer and all the blessings this season brings. Before our lives become even more chaotic, take some time to be with God. Take some time to listen to God. Spend some time in the Word of God. Seek to know what God "says" to us. "Be still! Don't start! Listen!"

Also needed are easily prepared foods like Cup of Soups, microwaveable mac & cheese, ramen noodles and individual packs of crackers and cookies. Travel size hygiene items and toothbrushes are always in need.

<u>Blessing Box Needs:</u> The Parish Life and Evangelism and Fellowship Committees are asking for two specific donations. They are **Star-Kist Tuna Creations:** <u>Deli Style Tuna Salad</u> and **Star-Kist Chicken Creations:** <u>Chicken Salad</u>. These items do not need refrigeration and resist spoiling due to extreme temperatures. A container is available in the Narthex for these specific items. These two items will be collected throughout the summer.

<u>United Churches Food Pantry:</u> Needed are pancake syrup, flour, white and brown sugar, chicken noodle soup, Spam, rice, Alfredo sauce, condiments, salt and pepper shakers, mayo, canned fruit/mandarin oranges, honey and wide egg noodles.

<u>Shepherd of the Streets:</u> Needed for men and women are shampoo and conditioner, toothbrushes, toothpaste, body wash, deodorant and bars of soap.

OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD


