Special Congregational Meeting

Church Council has voted to hold a special congregational meeting on **September 14th**. This meeting will take place after both the 8:00 service and the 10:30 service with a suspension of the meeting between services. 50 voting members are required for a quorum.

We are meeting to vote on the updated dossal replacement budget. The church constitution requires congregational approval for expenditures in excess of \$20,000. We estimate the cost of this project to most likely cost between \$25,000 and \$30,000. This includes the purchase of fabric and orphreys (like the sample display in the narthex) from Merhaut Company, Allison Park; panel upholstery by The Barn Fabric Center, Williamsport; and the removal and reinstallation of the panels, as well as general contracting, by Lundy Construction Company, Williamsport.

To date, St. Mark's has received approximately \$13,000.00 in donations toward the dossal project. Due diligence has been given to this project over the past several years, with many discussions held to work out every detail. Please join us on **September 14th** to cast your vote on the dossal replacement budget. Thank you.

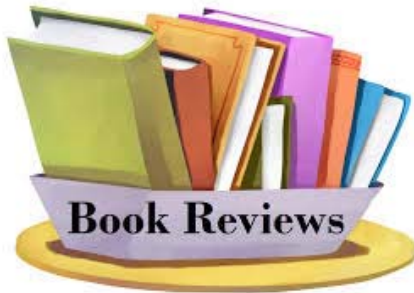

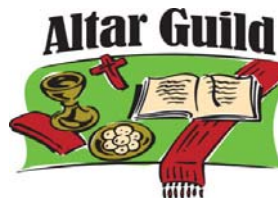

St. Mark's Council meeting- August 18, 2025

Call to Order: 6:00 pm

Council recited the Defining Mission Statement

Herb Poff led an excellent discussion on adding 12 niches to the Columbarium.

EC 2025.08.02- Council is asked to approve \$7,920.00 for the purchase and installation of the 12 new Columbarium Niches in the Chapel and additional matching faceplates. APPROVED.

Minutes of the June meeting were reviewed and approved as submitted.

Deb Buckman delivered the Treasurer's Report. The report was accepted contingent on receiving the July 2025 account report.

Pastor's Report: Pastor shared his Pastoral duties for July and August. The bishop will visit at some point this year. He explained some facts from Synod Assembly. Over half of our congregations have no called pastor. United Churches of Lycoming County are moving to 520 W. Fourth St. next week.

All statistical reports have been completed.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Evangelism and Fellowship: Cathy Fenderson presented a lengthy report. Everyone is happy with the July 4 event. Plans are in the works for the celebration of our nation's 250th anniversary and our congregations 150th. Fifteen pints were collected in the

Finance: Deb Buckman presented the report. Cindy Todd volunteered to produce a document having all of the Memorial Accounts accessible to council and those interested in the fund.

Little Lambs: Pastor, Vicki Haussmann, and Donna Clark met with Mrs. Peachie on August 18. Next meeting October 20.

Nominating: No report.

Personnel: No report.

Property: Proper door closers have been installed on the Fellowship Hall and Sacristy doors.

Publicity- No report.

Safety- A meeting will be held on October 6.

Worship and Music: Meeting is scheduled for August 24.

Unfinished business:

WM 2025.08.01: To approve the Worship and Music Committee's proposal that a special meeting of St. Mark's Congregation be convened to consider replacing the worn dossal panels. The budget is expected to be in excess of \$20,000.00. APPROVED.

God's Work-Our Hands will be observed on September 7.

CC 2025.08.01. (M Nikki/2 Cindy) Facilities use requests for the Williamsport Music Club on April 28, 2026 and the Williamsport Chamber Chorus and Orchestra on November 14 and April 17, 2026. Monday rehearsals will continue during the year. (M Nikki/2 Cindy) Approved.

Sight and Sound presentation of *Noah!* will be on September 24, 2025. Cheryl Williams is organizing it- cost is \$177.76

CC2025.06.01 (Huff/Todd) Moved to investigate the baby grand piano offered to us through Civic Chorus. Sam will check on how it might fit in with our programs. It was decided that the piano did not fit our needs.

Cindy Todd led us in closing prayer.

For food insecure families with children there is no vacation from hunger during the summer. In August, we continued to help ease that burden with our cereal collection. The congregation donated **118 boxes of assorted cereal**

Our final Cereal Sunday is September 14, 2025.

To date, we have collected 119 boxes of cereal. **Can we get to an overall total of 225 boxes?**

(Any donations of nonperishable food are also appreciated.)

Ongoing Collections at St. Mark's:

Travel size hygiene items and toothbrushes are always in need.

Blessing Box Needs: The Parish Life and Evangelism and Fellowship Committees are grateful to the congregation for their donation of dozens of packets of Star-Kist Tuna Creations: Deli Style Tuna Salad and Star-Kist Chicken Creations: Chicken Salad. These packets made the distribution of sandwiches possible during the blistering heat of summer. **The FINAL collection of these two items will be Sunday, September 14, 2025.**
