Pastor's Lion Message for November 2025

Pastor's "Lion" Message November, 2025

Give thanks to the Lord for he is good, for God's steadfast love endures forever (Psalm 136:1).

Beginning on November 2, and continuing through November 23 St. Mark's will be emphasizing stewardship. Traditionally we define stewardship as money, specifically money related to the church. And there is some truth in that. Stewardship does include monetary offerings given to God through the church. But that is not all that stewardship involves.

To be stewards conveys the understanding that what we call ours we do not actually own. Stewardship, properly understood, means to use all that we have been given in such a way that pleases the giver. Biblical stewardship then, seeks to use all that God has given in a way that pleases God.

We believe that our God is an abundant giver. God has given and continues to give to us life, forgiveness and life eternal. We do not bring life about; it is a gift. We do not earn forgiveness; it is a gift. Our behavior does not give way to life eternal; it is a gift. All these are gifts of God's abundant mercy. Be-


