### Pastor's Lion Message for December 2025

#### Pastor's "Lion" Message December, 2025

"I don't know what's wrong with me. Christmas is coming but I just don't seem happy about it...Is there anybody out there who knows what Christmas is all about?"

So asks the character Charlie Brown in the 1965 television special, *A Charlie Brown Christmas*.

*A Charlie Brown Christmas* will celebrate the 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary of its television debut on December 9, 2025. I point to this anniversary because of this television special's great significance. Never before had a children's Christmas television special include the Christmas story according to Luke in its broadcast. Network television executives were leery about including the Christian Christmas story but Charles Shultz, creator of the "Peanuts" strip, insisted it be there. And so, Charlie Brown, and all the world, were told that Christmas is all about the birth of Jesus.

This year, Christmas Eve 2025, St. Mark's will use Charlie Brown's question, and the answer to that question, as it's format for Christmas Eve worship. At both services we

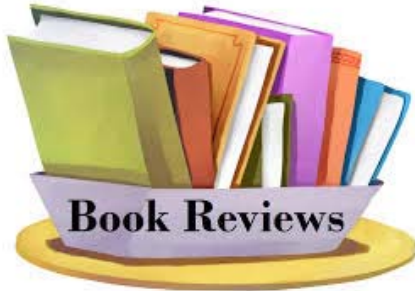

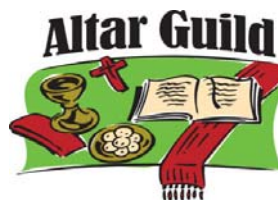

Treasurer's Report: The report was accepted and filed for audit.

Memorial Funds Update: Cindy Todd presented a document showing the Memorial Contributions from 2023-25. Discussion followed and all thanked Cindy for her efforts to present the update to council.

Pastor's Report: Pastor presented his pastoral duties for the month. Lectionary Group Study, Conference meetings, Pastor's lunch, Men's Fellowship (pancake/sausage breakfast on 1/4/26), receiving Ryan Kane into membership, annual meeting on 12/7, and annual meeting were presented.

October study averaged 14 people per week.

The pastors of Redeemer Lutheran, St. Luke Lutheran, and St. Mark's Lutheran continue to provide pastoral care for the Liberty Parish.
