Close to the end of the month of January the Church commemorates two great apostles, perhaps the greatest apostles: Simon, son of Jonah (Peter) and Saul of Tarsus (Paul). Peter, led by the Holy Spirit, confessed that Jesus was the Messiah, the Son of the living God. Paul, a one time persecutor of the Church, met the resurrected Christ on the Damascus Road and from that point on, became an "Apostle to the Gentiles".

These two apostles represent the character of Christ's Church: Catholic and Evangelical.

Catholic. A specific way of liturgical tradition, form and custom. A link to Judaism and Jewish reference.

Evangelical. Of the gospel; a proclamation of the good news of salvation for all

people (Evangelical literally means “good news” or gospel).

The Feast Days of Peter (January 18) and Paul (January 25) bookend the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. This week reminds us that these two servants of Jesus put their background, pride and prejudice behind them and agreed to work for the good of the gospel. Not two separate movements, but one Lord, one faith one baptism.

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is a call of the Church to work for the good of the whole; to minister in the name of Christ and to recognize all Christians for their efforts. The Week of Prayer reminds believers of our unity in Christ – the tradition of Peter and Paul – and urges us to find ways to celebrate that unity in various and specific ways of uniformity.

The Church has made great strides toward the effort of greater unity among Christians these past two decades: Ecumenical Prayer and Worship Services; Pulpit Exchanges; Full Communion among denominations; The Joint Declaration on Justification between Roman Catholics and Lutherans to name a few. These expressions of unity would have looked almost impossible a few years ago. But like the great apostles before us, we, led by the Holy Spirit and prayer, agreed to put differences aside and proclaim Christ rather than ourselves.

It is my hope and prayer that during this upcoming Week of Prayer all of us will continue to celebrate and work towards even greater unity in Christ. He is our identity. He is our one foundation. If the Church is not willing to be the Church, who will?

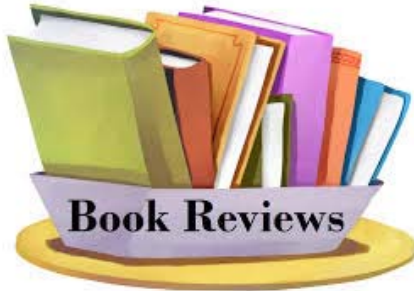

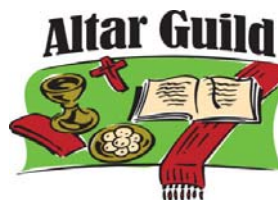

Thank You for the many December's Gifts

The Evangelism and Fellowship Committee thanks the congregation for their support of our many December projects. Without your continued support we could not have been the hands of God at this very special time of year.

During December the Evangelism and Fellowship Committee, with generous assistance from the congregation, provided the following outreach:

We participated with the congregation in the Reverse Advent project. We will assist the Faith Formation Committee with the sorting and delivering of these many donations.

Congregation members donated more than one hundred assorted clothing items, hygiene items, fleece throws, activity books and watches to the residents of the Danville State Hospital. The committee is grateful for Tracy Fox of Redeemer Lutheran for transporting our items along with Redeemer's items to Danville.

Congregation members also donated body wash, assorted snacks and pudding cups for the sixteen ladies of CM-6 and their caregivers at the Selinsgrove Center. Each lady received a gift bag of slipper socks, body wash and a pack of pudding cups. A basket of snacks were prepared for their caregivers. Finally, after an absence of several years we were able to entertain the ladies in person. A good time was had by all.

On December 5, we hosted our third Red Cross Blood Drive of 2025 in Fellowship Hall. Sixteen units of blood were collected including a donation from Wanda Fortin. We have tentative plans to schedule three blood drives for 2026.

Thank you to the members of the congregation who took Christmas cards from the table in the Narthex, added a cheery message and mailed them to our Special Concerns Folks and others we do not see as often as we would like.

The handmade ornaments crafted by Theresa Furman, Cindy Todd and Lou Ann Zeigler brought joy to many. All monetary donations will be given as grocery gift cards to Code Blue, an emergency, overnight shelter for the homeless at First Church.

After an absence of many years, members of the congregation went caroling to many of our Special Concern Folks. It was a sunny day, made more merrier by these visits.

These gestures of Christmas spirit given by members of our congregation were certain to cheer the individuals receiving them in Christ's name.

Ongoing Collections at St. Mark's:

Please know we understand that much was given in December for a number of projects, but the need continues. The Evangelism and Fellowship Committee is grateful for any items members can donate at this time.

United Churches Food Pantry: Canned fruit, canned Chili and Beef Stew, Instant Potatoes and Ketchup.

Shepherd of the Streets: If it keeps a person clean, it is needed. They are also in need of new or gently used towels and washcloths and slightly used winter coats.

Blessing Boxes at New Covenant UCC: We are sharing the snack items that were donated during Reverse Advent with the Blessing Boxes and Code Blue. But we continue to accept travel size hygiene items and anything else you usually donate.
