Pastor's “Lion” Message February, 2026
On Wednesday, February 18, the Season of Lent begins. Lent is the season of preparation for Easter Sunday and the entire Easter Season. Before we celebrate all the blessings Easter brings us, it is a good thing to “sit back and take it all in”; to take time to contemplate the entire message of Emmanuel, God with us and how God in Christ wins the battle of sin and death. Lent provides that opportunity.

This year, in addition to Sunday morning services and personal devotions, St. Mark's will provide a series of mid-week studies on the prophet Isaiah designed to better prepare us for the Easter message. Wednesdays in Lent, beginning February 25 and concluding March 25, we will gather in Fellowship Hall from 12:10 – 12:50 pm, to study how the themes associated with Isaiah echo the mission and ministry of Jesus. Our schedule appears below:

Feb. 25: The “Fast” of Isaiah and how it differs from a “traditional fast”.

March 4: Isaiah's call to “biblical holiness” (it's not what you think).

March 11: How best to be prepared for God's Reign?

To know Christ and to make Christ known.





Pastor's Report: Pastor presented his pastoral duties for the month. Lectionary Group Study, Conference meetings, Pastor's lunch, Christmas Eve worship, Men's Fellowship (pancake/sausage breakfast on Jan.4). He visited Little Lambs on December 10.

He also presented information for the Go Tell it IN the Mountains Initiative on Sunday, February 1.

The pastors of Redeemer Lutheran, St. Luke Lutheran, and St. Mark's Lutheran continue to provide pastoral care for the Liberty Parish.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Evangelism and Fellowship and Parish Life- The goal is to continue our regular projects, collections, blood drive, sandwich making, desserts for Redeemer dinners, dinners for Habitat for Humanity and VBS, card ministry as well as thinking of ideas for the July 4 celebration. Devin Owen and Cheryl Williams will be helping with the sandwich crew.

Faith Formation- Over 1,100 items of non-perishable foods were distributed to various agencies as well as \$370.00 in gift cards to Code Blue due to the Blue Stars made by Lou Ann, Cindy T., and Teresa F. Souper Bowl is February 8; Shrove Tuesday February 17 (Men's group will make the doughnuts, and Lenten Bible Study will begin on February 25 on Prophet Isaiah.

Financial- Audit completed January 16 with results to follow. Discussed Brotherhood Mutual Insurance and workers' comp liability. Insurance cost for 2026 is \$12,700.00. We need to conduct an inventory of worship items (chalices, altar candles, etc.) for insurance purposes.

A Suggested Covenant of Conduct

St. Mark's Lutheran Church

In order for our congregation and Church Council to deal effectively with issues, please follow the following guidelines:

1. All members of St. Mark's affirm their right to express their opinions concerning the life and ministry of St. Mark's Lutheran Church.
2. Members are encouraged to share their opinions directly with the pastor, Church Council, Church Committee Members and at the Annual Meeting of the Congregation.
3. When opinions are expressed to the pastor, Church Council and Church Committee Members, the question to the person sharing the information shall be, "What do you wish to have me do with this information?"
4. When an individual not elected to Church Council wishes to address the Church Council, this person, shall be made aware of the meeting date/time. The Council President and pastor shall be notified that this individual will be present at the meeting.
5. If an individual does not wish to address the Church Council in person, the individual must give permission to use their name. If permission is not given, the Council Member cannot share the concern/comment. The Council will not act on anonymous letters or hearsay.
6. All opinions not requiring action may be shared in writing with the entire Council.
7. At his/her discretion, a Council Member may ask any individual to refer any concern/comment to another Council Member for presentation.
8. Each item/issue shall be placed on the agenda and recorded in the minutes of record.
9. All Council business is to take place following – not before – the opening prayer.
10. No individual not elected to Council may "show up" at a Council Meeting to voice an opinion, or present an item/issue, without notifying the President of Council or pastor at least 4 days in advance. Non-elected individuals who wish to voice an opinion or present an item/issue without notifying the President of Council or pastor will be not heard.

Council Meeting Ground Rules

- Start meeting on time
- Have a prepared agenda
- End the meeting on a mutually agreed upon time
- No after meeting parking lot discussions
- Complete items requiring action as agreed
- One person speaks at a time
- All Council Members are looked upon as “equal” (set apart, not above)
- Turn off or mute all cell phones and devices
- Address conflict by dealing with the issue not the person
- Notify the Council if you will be absent
- Listen actively and attentively
- Participate do not lurk
- Practice confidentiality (what's said in the room stays in the room)
- Have fun but not at another's personal expense; be civil and respectful of others
- Opportunity will be given to comment or ask questions before each vote
- Unless otherwise directed, all questions/comments will be recorded.
- Be present physically and mentally

*Please Note: Failure to comply with these simple ground rules may result with the Council President asking an individual to leave the meeting.
