for their faith. They took the teachings of Jesus and did great things. All the world stands in awe of them. They put us to shame.

Such feelings are not the point of these commemorations. The witnesses who have gone before us are not remembered to shame us, they are to encourage us. Against all odds, often when their lives were threatened, they chose Christ. They, like Jesus, like the prophets before them, represented God when the world forgot about God. When the cry went out, "Why doesn't someone do something" they said, "Okay. Show me what to do; who to stand up for; where to go." They are to inspire us.

To follow Jesus as Savior and Lord is to be a disciple of the One who has come to change life for the better. He is not our deep, dark secret that is so highly personal we keep him hidden never to talk about or model. Jesus asks our faith to be highly personal, but never private. The gospel that God loves us and asks us to show that love for us in service to others, is always public.

The last few days of March begin Holy Week, the last week of Jesus' earthly ministry. As he goes to the cross to proclaim God's love, he asks his followers to witness to that love; to show care, compassion, understanding, sacrifice and mercy to others. The "Saints of March" responded. May the Holy Spirit lead us to do the same.

Treasurer's report (Deb Buckman) – The report was accepted and filed for audit.

Memorial Funds update (Cindy Todd) – The Memorial Committee motioned Council to approve the Memorial Donation Policy, Procedure and Request for Transfer of Funds as presented. Donna Clark seconded the motion. There was no discussion.


